



Librarians Without Borders[®] Grant Awarded to the University of Zimbabwe, College of Health Sciences Library for the Support of Information Literacy Training

The 2010 Librarians Without Borders[®] Grant has been awarded to the University of Zimbabwe, College of Health Sciences Library. The library's proposal is titled 'Information Literacy Training for University of Zimbabwe, College of Health Sciences Students'. The \$5,000 grant will support the Library's information literacy training by funding the purchase of an LCD projector, laptop computer, photocopier and related supplies.

The grant proposal details the need for such equipment to further instruction in several required courses and expands the current level of training throughout the College of Health Sciences.

The University of Zimbabwe recognizes that information literacy is an integral part of teaching, learning and research, and the library plays an essential role in providing such instruction. The instruction will also highlight the use of electronic resources accessible through HINARI (www.who.int/hinari/) and other sources.

The proposal was submitted by Mrs. Agnes Chikonzo, University Librarian at the University of Zimbabwe. The award is part of a three-year grant from FlySheet Med-Informatics Co., Ltd for the support of health library related projects in HINARI-eligible countries. The 2009 LWB Grant was awarded to the University of Ibadan Medical Library, Nigeria for the purchase of health science monographs and computer workstations.
